DID YOU KNOW?



Washington, D.C. was planned as the new Egypt on the Potomac River; There are 40 Boundary Stones, surrounding the Federal City (Washington, D.C.) To identify the federal enclave - (enclave; distinct unit enclosed within foreign territory); The people of KMT (Egypt) first used these Markers.

In 1867, Howard University sponsored the first High School for Blacks in Washington, D.C.

General Benjamin O. Davis, Jr., the 3rd African-American to graduate from the Military Academy at West Point in 1936, during his four years at the academy, no one spoke to him after duty hours.

Former U.S. Senator from Mississippi, Blanche Kelso Bruce was the 1st African-American to sign his name on U.S. currency during the 1880's.

Dr. Patrick Francis Healy, President of Georgetown University in the 1870's was the 1st and only African-American President of Georgetown University in Washington, D.C.
